


RELIGION VS. GOVERNMENT POLICIES

- Cambodia








CASE STUDY: CASTE SYSTEM

System was outlawed but still


pervades in society

- Can be inter or intra faith






CASE STUDY: NORTHERN IRELAND


- 87% Roman Catholic

- Series of wars between 1096 1204






- Muslim Pakistan and Bangladesh




TENSIONS IN SAHEL REGION
