
- Continental

Southeast Asia

Maritime space

- Archipelago of about 25,000 islands.
- Plate tectonics:
 - Intense volcanism
- Most of the Southeast Asian part of the Eurasian plate was above water during the last Ice Age (up to 16,000 years ago).


Southeast Asia Issues

Cultural fragmentation

- complex ethnic, linguistic, and religious patterns
- Shatter Belt:
 - A state or group of states that are influenced by other larger states.
 - Often culturally, economically, and politically fragmented

 - Malay-Indonesian dominance


External influences

- Historically stronger than internal influences.
- China brought civilization and technology (early history).
- India brought religion (Hinduism and Buddhism).
- Middle Eastern countries brought Islam and trade.
- Europe brought trade and colonialism.
- USA and Japan brought imperialism (at different levels):
 - Recently brought trade and development.

INDOCHINA

Southeast Asian Problems

- Straining resources such as petroleum and lumber:
 - Destruction of the tropical forest.
 - Over fishing and coral reefs.
- Pursuing economic integration policy (ASEAN):
 - Promote regional security issues; later concerned economic issues.
 - Common market by 2008.
 - Tariffs to be cut to 5% or less.


Regional setting

- From the Greek *Indos* (India) and *Nesos* (Island), literally the "Indian Islands."
- 17,000 islands:
 - About 6,000 inhabited.
 - Longest coastline in the world.
- Controls two strategic straits:
 - Sunda and Malacca.
 - Through which much of the world's oil traffic must pass.

Volcanism

- Intense volcanic and seismic activity.
- 300 volcanoes of which 200 have been historically active.

Tectonic Activity in Indonesia



Krakatau

Exploded in 1883; Largest volcanic eruption in known history.

Explosion heard at 3,000 miles; 20 cubic kilometers of rock into the atmosphere.

Tsunami drowned 34,000 people and ashes burned to death 2,000 people.

30 meters waves that traveled 8,000 miles.









Rivers

■ Rivers:

- Mekong River
 - Begins in China and crosses several Southeast Asian nations
 - Forms a boundary between Myanmar and Laos and between Laos and Thailand

- Irrawaddy River
 - Begins in Himalayas
 - Flows through Myanmar





Straits of Malacca

- Important shipping channel
- Connects Indian Ocean with Pacific Ocean
- Malaysia, Indonesia and Singapore along it

- One of the most expensive cities









Deepest place in the world




